# **Summary of the York Rite Conferences:**

### The Grand High Priest highlighted summary is:

The membership motto from our immediate Past Grand High Priest, Very Excellent Tommy F. Chapman was "Recruit, Retain and Reinstate". ### The Grand Master highlighted summary is:
