




The Royal Arch Masons of Texas

Often abbreviated RAM of TX this 501c10 group is a part of the Freemasons. The Royal Arch Masons are a worldwide organization found in many countries of the world such as Great Britain, Scotland, Ireland, Australia, Canada, The United States, and Israel where Grand Chapters act as the governing body of small local Royal Arch Chapters. Membership in The Royal Arch Chapter is required to become a member of The Royal & Select Masters and The Commandry. These three bodies make up the "York Rite" within the state of Texas. Other countries throughout the world having Grand Chapters may only have a Chapter and some may have only Chapters & Councils depending on their governing By-Laws.

Royal Arch Masonry, also known as "Capitular Masonry", is the first part of the York Rite of Masonic degrees. Royal Arch Masons meet as a *Chapter*. The Capitular degrees are a set of four degrees controlled by the Royal Arch Chapter. They center on the construction of Solomon's Temple.

The Wichita Falls Chapter of Royal Arch Masons #202 has been continually operating since 1898. It is now located at 3503 Kemp Blvd. in Wichita Falls.

The Quanah Chapter of Royal Arch Masons was chartered on December 5th, 1944. Quanah Chapter No. 450 has been doing good works for the past 73 years. It is located on 601 Loop rd. in Quanah, TX.

CHARITIES:

One of the charities Quanah Chapter supports is the Masonic Home & School of Texas, which began in 1899. It was first named The Masonic Widows and Orphans Home in south Fort Worth. In 1913 it became a Texas independent school district and entered it's students in sports like tennis until 2005 when their last graduating class crossed the stage. They were once a formidable school beating Wichita Falls High School in 4 football games & having a 7-7 tie once during the years 1934-1942. In 2007, The Masonic Home and School of Texas began operating to provide qualified children and widows with financial support. They now provide information and referral services for Texas children, widows and families. Other services include providing food, clothing, transportation, medical, dental, prescription services, tutoring, career counseling and educational scholarships.

<u>The Texas Masonic Retirement Center</u> is owned and operated by The Royal Arch Masons of Texas who has been providing quality care to senior members of the Texas fraternity since 1911. It is situated on a 100-acre tract of land in the heart of Arlington, Texas. It provides the best quality care possible along with ideal surroundings for senior Masons of Texas and the widows of Masons in Texas. The TMRC is financially supported by 103 active Chapters in the State of Texas.

The RAM of TX are part of a combined fraternity of Masonic organizations. In the U.S.A. alone all branches of Masonry combined provide over \$1.5 million dollars of charitable aid per day.



PESACH / PASSOVER



PESACH Holiday

This year it is the Jewish Year of 5777: sunset April 10, 2017 through nightfall April 18, 2017

Significance: Remembers the Exodus from Egypt

Observances: Avoiding all leavened grain products and related

foods; Family or communal retelling of the Exodus story

Length: 8 days (Some: 7 days)

Pesach, known in English as Passover, is one of the most commonly observed Jewish holidays, even by otherwise non-observant Jews.

Pesach begins on the 15th day of the Jewish month of Nissan. It is the first of the three major festivals with both historical and agricultural significance (the other two are Shavu'ot and Sukkot). Agriculturally, it represents the beginning of the harvest season in Israel, but little attention is paid to this aspect of the holiday. The primary observances of Pesach are related to the Exodus from Egypt after generations of slavery. This story is told in Exodus, Ch. 1-15. Many of the Pesach observances are instituted in Chapters. 12-15.

The name "Pesach" (PAY-sahch, with a "ch" as in the Scottish "loch") comes from the Hebrew root Pei-Samekh-Cheit (in Hebrew), meaning to pass through, to pass over, to exempt or to spare. It refers to the fact that G-d "passed over" the houses of the Jews when he was slaying the firstborn of Egypt. In English, the holiday is known as Passover. "Pesach" is also the name of the sacrificial offering (a lamb) that was made in the Temple on this holiday. The holiday is also referred to as Chag he-Aviv Chag he-Aviv (in Hebrew), (the Spring Festival), Chag ha-Matzot Chag ha-Matzot (in Hebrew), (the Festival of Matzahs), and Z'man Cheiruteinu Z'man Cheiruteinu (in Hebrew), (the Time of Our Freedom) (again, all with those Scottish "ch"s).

Probably the most significant observance related to Pesach involves avoiding chametz (leaven; sounds like "hum it's" with that Scottish "ch") throughout the holiday. This commemorates the fact that the Jews leaving Egypt were in a hurry, and did not have time to let their bread rise. It is also a symbolic way of removing the "puffiness" (arrogance, pride) from our souls.

And if your son asks you in the future, saying, what are the testimonies, and the statutes, and the judgments, that the L-RD our G-d commanded you? You will say to your son, we were slaves to Pharaoh in Egypt; and the L-RD brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand. The L-RD gave signs and wonders, great and harmful, against Egypt, against Pharaoh, and against all his household, before our eyes: And he brought us out of there to bring us in, to give us the land that he promised our fathers. -Deuteronomy 6:20-23

The text of the Pesach seder is written in a book called the Haggadah.

The Haggadah tells the story of the Exodus from Egypt and explains some of the practices and symbols of the holiday.

AMD --- A Historical Sketch of Its Beginnings

The Allied Masonic Degrees are an invitational organization, and requires membership in the Royal Arch as well as the Symbolic Lodge. Membership is limited to 27 members per council.

Be it remembered that on August 5, 1933, this Grand Council took as its date of formation January 14, 1892, since this date was the beginning of the Allied Masonic Degrees in America with the formation of the Sovereign College of Allied Masonic and Christian Degrees at Richmond, Virginia, that on April 16, 1932, the subsequent establishment of a Grand Council of Allied Masonic Degrees of the United States of America occurred in Salisbury, North Carolina, and that the union of the two bodies was drawn up and entered into July 18, 1933, and was ratified by the North Carolina Grand Council August 5, 1933 and was ratified by the Sovereign College at Norway, Maine August 24, 1933, and became effective as of September 7, 1933.

The Allied Masonic Degrees are detached degrees some of which, many years ago, were conferred under Craft warrants and formed part of the then loosely governed Freemasonry of the period.

Many of these detached degrees became dormant in some places, although in others they were conferred as side degrees. In time, the better of these degrees were grouped together in an organized body under the title of Allied Masonic Degrees. The degrees comprising the system in our Jurisdiction in the U.S.A. are the Royal Ark Mariner, Secret Monitor, Knight of Constantinople, Saint Lawrence the Martyr, Architect, Superintendent, Grand Tilers of Solomon, Master of Tyre, Excellent Master, Installed Sovereign Master, Installed Commander Noah, Red Branch of Eri and Ye Ancient Order of Corks. They are conferred in the United States in Councils chartered by the Grand Council. Each Council is limited to twenty-seven members, with two exceptions. One of these Councils is known as the Council of the Nine Muses and is limited to nine members. The other is the Grand Masters Council, which has what is known as a roving charter. The purpose of the latter Council is to provide a place of membership in the Allied Masonic Degrees for brethren residing in localities where Councils have not been organized. Membership in every Council of Allied Masonic Degrees is by invitation, and is predicated on membership in the Royal Arch Chapter.

In addition to perpetuating these degrees, there is still another and equally important purpose. It is to bring together, in small groups, Freemasons who are interested in the advancement of all Masonry, preparing themselves to better serve the Craft through the medium of study and research. By limiting the membership in a Council and securing membership only by invitation, the result is a congenial group able to enjoy full fellowship when meeting together. Wherever there is an active Council of Allied Masonic Degrees, it exerts an influence for the betterment of Freemasonry in all the Masonic Bodies.

There is no intention on the part of the Allied Masonic Degrees to detract from any organized and established body of Masonry. On the contrary, you will find our members active, beyond the average, in all local Masonic bodies. The real purpose is to stimulate interest in Masonry in general and bring together in small groups those who are interested in the study of Masonic subjects. Thus, they are better enabled to serve the Craft.

Ned Eugene Dull

Forty Seventh Grand Master

1982-1985

SPRINGBORO, Ohio — Ned Eugene Dull, 93, currently residing with family in Springboro and longtime resident and business owner in Van Wert, died at 1 a.m. Wednesday morning, January 9th, 2017 He was born on Oct. 18, 1923, in Ohio City, the son of the late Eugene Arthur and Faye Leona (Dudgeon) Dull. On Jan. 29, 1944, he married the former Margaret Irene Stahl, his junior high school sweetheart, who preceded him in death on Aug. 8, 1991.

Ned was a 1941 graduate of Ohio City-Liberty High School who attended the Ohio State University and The Citadel in Charleston, South Carolina. He was a World War II veteran of the U.S. Army having served in the 100th Infantry. He returned to work and owned the family business, Dull Lumber and Supply Company, for the next 50 years.

After retiring from the lumber business, he became the Grand Recorder of the United Grand Imperial Council, Red Cross of Constantine for the next 20 years in Springfield, Illinois. He was a former member and active trustee of the First United Methodist Church in Van Wert. Ned was a member of the Van Wert Elks, VFW, American Legion and the Rotary Club with over 64 years of perfect attendance. Ned thoroughly enjoyed vacationing in Naples, Florida, and was an avid golf and bridge player.

A very large and important part of his life was the Masonic Fraternity. He was a member and presiding officer of the Masonic Lodge, Chapter, Council and Commandery of Van Wert. He was the senior 33rd Degree member of the Valley of Toledo, Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry. Ned was also a member of the Ohio Priory 18 Knights of the York Cross of Honor. He started Knight Templar drill competition in Ohio as the captain of Ivanhoe Drill Team with three consecutive first place National Championships over a period of 18 years. Ned served as the Past Grand Commander of Ohio and was the senior Past Grand Master of the Grand Encampment, Knight Templars of the United States. He held yet another national office, as Past Grand Sovereign of the Grand Imperial Council Red Cross of Constantine, serving the United States, Mexico, the Philippines and Japan.

Family members include his four daughters, Deborah (Jack) Frysinger, Jr., of Naples, Florida, Rebecca (Kim) Davis of Columbus, Cindy (Gary) Kline of Springboro, and Kathie (Pat) Lewis of Grove City, Ohio; 11 grandchildren, and 10 great-grandchildren.
