Billie Eugene Davis was born July 18, 1928 in Huckabee, Texas. He worked for his father doing general farming work in Stephenville Texas, as well as other jobs as a youth. He is a proud Aggie. Billie was very active in all sports. He earned a B.S. degree in Civil Engineering in June, 1949.



He joined the Army in 1950. He received an honorable discharge from the Armed Forces of the United States of America on October 17, 1960. He was an inspector for the Highway department for 38 years, and was an inspector for the City of Fort Worth for 8 years, and served in the National Guard in Arlington Texas.

Billie was raised to the sublime degree of a Master Mason on July 12, 1962 at Arlington Masonic Lodge #438.

Billie served as Worshipful Master of Harmony Lodge #592 in 1998-2000. In 2000, he also was appointed as District Deputy Grand Master of Masonic District Number 64-D by then Grand Master W. Vernon Burke, Jr.

George W. Bush Presidential Library

This permanent exhibit at the George W. Bush Presidential Library and Museum looks at the life and career of President George W. Bush. The exhibit brings the story of President and Mrs. Bush's leadership to life for visitors by highlighting the principles they followed when making key decisions and by promoting an understanding of the Presidency, American history, and public policy.

Some of the highlights of this exhibit are "A Nation Under Attack" - Remember the events of September 11, 2001, and honor the lives lost. Artifacts, including steel from the World Trade Center that visitors may touch. "Life in the

White House" - Peek behind the closed doors of 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue to see what life is like inside the White House. Enjoy a film in the White House Theater about Camp David, the Bush Ranch in Texas, and the President and First Lady's sense of humor. "The Oval Office" - The Oval Office exhibit is an exact replica, in scale and design, as the one in the White House during the Bush Administration.

Explore the exhibits at your own pace with a prerecorded audio guide and delve into the life, times, legacy, and political achievements of one of America's most popular presidents.

The Stockyards Train Trip and Shopping



You will take a ride on the Grapevine Vintage Railroad along the historic Cotton Belt Route from Grapevine to the Fort Worth Stockyards. Passengers enjoy riding in authentic 1920's Victorian-style coaches as they take a step back in time and experience train travel as it was in the glory days of the expanding West. You will pull into the Fort Worth Stockyards Station, right in the middle of the Stockyards National Historic District where the Old West comes alive.

The Old West comes to life before your eyes during the Fort Worth Herd's cattle drive. Genuine Texas cowhands drive a herd of Texas longhorns down Exchange Avenue in the Stockyards National Historic District. Every detail of the cattle drive, from the saddles and chaps to the boots and hats, are authentic and historically true. There will also be time for you to explore and shop at the local shops in this historic district.
