

<u>What:</u> A series of eight seminars will be hosted by Stephenville Chapter, Council, and Commandery. The first five seminars will explore the source of the Capitular Degrees, their symbolism and esoteric meaning with the help of the *Capitular Development Course* developed by Piers Vaughan. An additional three seminars are tentatively planned for fall 2019 to be sponsored by the Council and Commandery respectively.

<u>Who:</u> Any Royal Arch Mason in good standing who is a member of a regular chapter recognized by the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Texas, and who is enrolled and registered. Subsequent seminars will require membership in the appropriate York Rite body (Council or Commandery.)

When: We will meet monthly on the fourth Tuesday of each month January through May, and August through October. A presentation followed by discussion will begin at 6:30 PM, and last no more than about an hour.

Where: Stephenville Masonic Lodge, 244 S Columbia Street in Stephenville.

<u>Registration</u>: Attendees may enroll at any meeting; however only those who attend January through May and participate in the Capitular Development Course (CDC) will receive a lapel pin acknowledging completion of the course. A registration fee of \$25 is payable to Stephenville Chapter No. 140, R.A.M.

Sponsorship: This series of seminars is sponsored by the York Rite Bodies in Stephenville, Texas.

Course Outline

- I. Background and Overview of Capitular, Cryptic, and Chivalric Masonry in the United States and Texas. The January meeting will include a brief overview of all of the degrees of the York or American Rite of Freemasonry. At this first meeting, *CDC workbooks will be distributed*. January 22, 2019
- **II.** Mark Master Mason Degree. At the February meeting we will discuss the origins of the Mark degree and esoteric lessons found within this informative degree. *CDC Session 2*. February 26, 2019
- **III. Past Master Mason Degree.** At the March meeting we will discuss the background of the Past Master's Degree; differences between an Actual and Virtual Past Master; variations of the degree between jurisdictions and esoteric lessons. *CDC Session 3.* March 26, 2019
- IV. Most Excellent Master Degree. At the April meeting we will discuss the history, purpose, and esoteric lessons of the symbolic completion and dedication of the Temple. *CDC Session 3*. April 23, 2019
- V. Royal Arch Mason Degree. At the May meeting we will discuss the history and lessons of the Holy Royal Arch, the "very root, heart and

marrow of Freemasonry." This meeting will complete the Capitular Development Course, and hopefully begin a lifetime of reflection and study of the degree that completes the Master Masons Degree and the spiritual temple. *CDC Session 4*. May 28, 2019

- VI. Royal Master. At the August meeting we will hear a presentation on the history of the Cryptic Degrees in the United States and Texas. We will also discuss the esoteric lessons contained herein where we represented a zealous craftsman seeking masonic light from our ancient Grand Master. All Select Master Masons are invited to attend. August 27, 2019
- VII. Select Master. At the September meeting we will discuss the esoteric lessons contained within the deposit and completion of ancient craft masonry. All Select Master Masons are invited to attend. September 24, 2019
- VIII. Chivalric Orders. At the October meeting we will hear a presentation on the history of the Chivalric Orders, and discuss the symbolism of the Order of the Temple. We will also discuss plans for future Masonic Studies sponsored by the Stephenville York Rite Bodies. October 22, 2019
