

Message from the Grand Master

Wednesday, April 29, 2020

Grand Master's Proclamation

On April 27, 2020, Governor Greg Abbott issued new orders to open the State of Texas through the "Open Texas" plan. The Governor's Report to Open Texas can be found at

https://gov.texas.gov/uploads/files/organization/opentexas/OpenTexas-Report.pdf.

This plan is both a road map and guideline as to how various businesses and entities are to re-open. In light of this action, Texas Masonic Lodges are authorized to resume some activities by closely adhering to the following directives:

- 1. Commencing May 25, 2020, Lodges may hold stated meetings for the primary purpose of election of Lodge officers for the ensuing year. In addition, Lodges can conduct regular business appropriate to a stated meeting.
- 2. Lodges may not have called meetings until further proclamation from the Grand Master, other than one Lodge of Sorrow, or a called meeting for the purpose of installing officers.
- 3. No degrees will be conducted until further proclamation from the Grand Master.
- 4. No meals will be cooked or consumed at stated or called meetings at this time.
- 5. Strict social distancing rules as established in Governor Abbott's "Open Texas" will be followed, including the following:
 - (a) All Masons MUST keep a six-foot distance from other Masons.
 - (b) Masons are strongly urged, but are not required, to wear face masks;
 - (c) Lodges are encouraged to have hand sanitizer available at numerous places in the Lodge building;
 - (d) To maintain proper social distancing, Masons should not shake hands;
 - (e) Masons are encouraged to only attend their own Lodges, and not to visit other Lodges at this time;
- 6. Lodges that meet quarterly may hold a stated meeting on or after May 25, 2020, and prior to June 24, 2020, for the purpose of electing Lodge officers and other business appropriate to a stated meeting.
- 7. Most importantly, all Texas Masons are strongly encouraged NOT to attend Lodge if they have any signs of illness or do not feel comfortable in attending. Masons must self-screen for any signs or symptoms of COVID-19 before attending any Lodge meeting. Those individuals considered to be "at-risk", including those who are 65 or older, and especially those with chronic lung disease; moderate to severe asthma; chronic heart disease; severe obesity; diabetes; chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis; liver disease; weakened immune system or other risk factors are encouraged not to attend Lodge. You are the sole decision-maker as to whether you should attend Lodge. There is nothing more important at this time than the health and well-being of our Texas Masons.

Further Proclamations will be issued when it is deemed both safe and prudent to do so while, at the same time, adhering to the directives of the State of Texas on re-opening.



Dear Companions:

Governor Abbott has announced guidelines to reopen the Great State of Texas. The safety of our Companions and their families is the most important factor for us to consider as we move forward to re-authorize Cryptic Masonry to be practiced in this Grand Jurisdiction. We are all anxious to get back to the quarries and attend assemblies, degrees, and to fellowship with our Companions. However, the seriousness of this situation requires that we move forward in phases for the safety and sanity of our Companions and their families.

Therefore, it is my order that stated assemblies of constituent Councils may resume beginning on May 25, 2020 for the dispatch of business only. Called assemblies may be held only for the annual installation of officers. Councils which have their stated assemblies that fall outside of this time frame may request dispensation to have a called meeting for the purpose of holding officer elections. No other called assemblies may be held and no degrees conferred (including festivals) until July 1, 2020. Degrees may not be conferred at stated assemblies until July 1, 2020. All Thrice Illustrious Masters, Companions, and Councils are required to follow the social distancing guidelines outlined by the Governor of Texas, and local authorities.

Companions are discouraged from visiting Councils in which they are not a member until July 1, 2020. Any Companion who does not feel comfortable attending Cryptic events and functions at this time should not be made to do so, and Companions and Councils should not make an issue out of absences. I do encourage all Companions to reach out to those affected and those not comfortable attending assemblies and practice the noble tenets of Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth.

Like you, I am eager to move forward and have experienced frustrations. This situation has been a burden on all of us, emotionally, mentally, and perhaps financially. We will get through this. There is light at the end of the tunnel. A structured approach will get us there. I am going to borrow a line from our Brothers in the Scottish Rite, we will have order out of this chaos.

It is an honor to serve the Companions of Texas. I appreciate all you are doing for your families, your communities, and for Freemasonry. May the Supreme Grand Artificer watch over you all and your families. I look forward to coming together in fellowship again soon.

GRAND CONCLAVE & COVID - 19 UPDATE GENERAL ORDER NO. 3, SERIES 2019-2020 APRIL 27, 2020

To the Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Texas:

This General Order, like that of General Order No. 2, is an Emergency Order.

Due to the COVID-19 outbreak, and with guidance from the Grand Lodge of Texas and the Grand Encampment of the U.S.A., we have had to make the difficult decision to postpone the 2020 Annual Conclave. With the understanding of the guidelines that have been sent us to operate, we cannot meet as we normally do. With an affirmative vote of the Grand Commandery Officers, I have decided that we will meet using teleconferencing. This event will take place on Friday, the 19th of June 2020, at 7:00 pm until we conclude.

Please reserve the date and time if you plan to attend via teleconference. This will require the use of a computer or tablet with the appropriate software, or a phone for audio only access. Details for how to access the teleconference will be sent soon. For the purpose of conducting business, registration will still be required. The registration team is working on those details and will send a notice soon.

The business that we will need to conduct will include:

- 1. Grand Commander's Report
- 2. Grand Recorder's Report
- 3. Grand Treasurer's Report
- 4. Jurisprudence Report
- 5. Finance Report and Annual Budget
- 6. Resolutions
- 7. Election of Officers
- 8. Installation of Officers

We are having to do all of this because of the pandemic, but we need to perform these duties. I hope all of you will understand that this has been difficult for all of us, so it is going to require unusual things to happen. The main thing is that we need to conclude the business of the Grand Commandery this year. We have been locked down on our Stated Conclaves and Called Commandery Meetings. I am going to give permission for the Commanderies to do business by the use of teleconferencing only. I know that this will be a hardship for some Commanderies, but the Commanderies still need to pay their bills and take care of business. At this time, we cannot go on with business as usual.

Remember, the 2020 Annual Grand Conclave will be held on June 19th, 2020 at 7:00PM via teleconference. Details to follow.

I pray to God that everyone is staying safe during these trying times.

Worth Commandery Prelate's Message - THE STONE

Worth Commandery No. 19 Easter, April 12, 2020



Because of that sacrifice man's soul has been released from eternal death and sanctified to enter the glorious Kingdom of Heaven. The stone is rolled away! He is risen! All one has to do is follow Him out of that tomb and live according to His Word.

On this particular day we should each examine ourselves and ask the question, do I have my own stone blocking me from a daily personal walk with Him? Matthew 7:21 tells us, "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven." Margaret Mead



Years ago, anthropologist Margaret Mead was asked by a student what she considered to be the first sign of civilization in a culture. The student expected Mead to talk about fishhooks or clay pots or grinding stones.

But no. Mead said that the first sign of civilization in an ancient culture was a femur (thighbone) that had been broken and then healed. Mead explained that in the animal kingdom, if you break your leg, you die. You cannot run from danger, get to the river for a drink or hunt for food. You are meat for prowling beasts. No animal survives a broken leg long enough for the bone to heal.

A broken femur that has healed is evidence that someone has taken time to stay with the one who fell, has bound up the wound, has carried the person to safety and has tended the person through recovery. Helping someone else through difficulty is where civilization starts, Mead said."
