East Texas York Rite Festival – Saturday, Oct 24 at 7 am

Does your Texas York Rite Chapter & Council have candidates awaiting their York Rite degrees? Here is an opportunity that will benefit the Chapters and Councils of Texas. - the first outdoor York Rite degrees conferred in Texas in more than 60 years. There is a strong possibility that these will be the ONLY York Rite degrees conferred in East Texas in 2020.

We have received dispensation from the Grand Chapter and Grand Council of Texas to host and conduct York Rite Degrees for Chapter and Council on Saturday, October 24, 2020, providing that the degree conferrals:

1. Are held out-of-doors; and

2. Comply with all state and local health regulations, including those relating to the COVID-19 virus. We will comply with these requirements. If needed, masks will be provided to those attending, and social distancing will be in place, should these regulations still be in effect on October 24.

We are able to assemble both a degree team and have a great location for that date. The degrees will be conferred at the G.W. Pirtle Scout Reservation, 440 CR 1241, Gary City Tx 75643. This location is not far from Carthage and has enough parking, staging, restroom and food service facilities.

There are hotel rooms in Carthage available for those wishing to stay nearby in comfort. (Approximately 20 minutes from the camp.)

There are LIMITED campsites available for those who wish to arrive at the Scout Reservation the night before. (CALL US FIRST if this is your plan.)

8 a.m. Degree work begins.

12:15 - 1 p.m. Lunch

1 - 4 p.m. Remainder of degree work.

How to visit your loved one at Texas Masonic Retirement Center

- 1. TMRC residents may name up to 2 people as "Essential Caregivers"
- 2. Essential Caregivers must meet these requirements

Before a Visit to TMRC

- 1. Complete advance training and forms on
 - Use of proper protective equipment
 - Infection control measures
 - Hand hygiene
 - Cough and sneeze etiquette
- 2. Schedule your visit in advance with TMRC staff by calling 817-275-2893
- 3. Purchase your own protective equipment as described in training

Upon Arrival at TMRC

- Arrive at designated entry door for visitors
- Visitors must wear protective equipment described in training
- Present a photo ID
- Present a negative COVID-19 test performed within the last 14 days of your visit. Learn more about COVID-19 testing sites.
- Allow screening for any sign and symptoms of COVID-19 or respiratory illness

During the Visit

- TMRC staff will escort visitors to and from the resident's location
- Visitors cannot interact with any other resident

"Visits Through the Glass Door" Nursing Care Area Residents Welcome Visitors

Effective Immediately

We're delighted to announce our first limited visits between families, friends, and residents living our Nursing Care Area through our "Visits Through the Glass Door."

As we slowly allow visits, we continue our concern for the health and happiness of our residents and remain in compliance with regulations.

We know it's not a hug and kiss, but it is a face-to-face visit, with only a pane of glass separating loved ones.

Rules for "Visits Through the Glass Door"

Where is the Glass Door?

The glass door is an exterior clear glass door opening into a parlor in the Nursing Care Area.

How does a "Visit Through the Glass Door" take place?

- The resident will sit comfortably near a glass door in a parlor inside the Nursing Care Area. The visitor will sit on the opposite side of the glass door in a chair provided by our staff. The visitor will be completely outdoors.
- · The glass door separating the visitor and resident remains closed and locked during the entire visit.
- · A member of TMRC staff will stay with the resident to assist with the visit and to meet any other needs.
- · At this time, conversations will be through cell phones and speaker phones.
- · Visitors cannot enter the Nursing Care Area or any part of the building.
- Due to the size of the parlor and arrangements needed to offer these visits, no more than one visit may occur at any time. The
 area will be sanitized before and after each visit.
- Residents and visitors must wear face coverings over the mouth and nose at all times (as tolerated). Staff will wear personal
 protective equipment (PPE) as always.
- Visits will require advance scheduling by calling 817-275-2893. This is due to the need to schedule staff to accompany the
 resident and for the additional cleaning required before and after each visit

How do I schedule a visit?

- We invite you to call our office at 817-275-2893 to request a visit.
- Visiting days and times may be limited due to staffing requirements, but we will do our best to accommodate everyone as quickly as possible.

NO VISITATION IS ALLOWED in the nursing care area, other than visits that are "medically necessary." We are providing the opportunity to visit residents with our "Through the Glass Door" program (details described above). Exceptions will be considered under extraordinary circumstances, such as end-of-life situations. These visits must be scheduled and approved in advance by the Superintendent.

Independent Living Area Visitation

No person other than those deemed, by the Superintendent, to be "Critically Necessary" will be allowed to enter any building on the campus. HOWEVER, independent living residents may meet with visitors outdoors in a well-ventilated area.

While it is not recommended, you may meet with your family or friends OUTDOORS with these restrictions:

- · No more than 3 visitors at any one time
- Social distancing is practiced at all times
- · Visitors must wear a mask at all times
- · Residents must wear a mask at all times
- · Limit your visit to no more than 30 minutes
- No visitor enters any building on the TMRC campus for any reason!

Let us continue to work together to protect the health and safety of yourself, your neighbors, and our staff!
