## **Nursing Care Area Visitor Policy**

## Update from Gary Blair, Superintendent, Texas Masonic Retirement Center March 23, 2021

## We're very happy to announce the Texas State Health Department has made changes to ease restrictions for visitors to the Nursing Care Area of Texas Masonic Retirement Center

#### Here's the quick good news-

- Residents may enjoy visits from friends and family-not just Essential Caregivers!
- Two Essential Caregivers may visit a resident at the same time!
- COVID-19 tests are NOT required prior to visits!
- Visits may be in a resident's room or outdoors!
- End-of-life situations now offer much more flexibility for multiple visitors!

## Should an outbreak of COVID-19 occur on our campus, ALL visitation to the Nursing Care Area will cease until further notice, except for Essential Caregivers and end-of-life visits.

#### Indoor and Outdoor Visits – Family & Friends

Please review all information described below for requirements before and during your visit to a Nursing Care Area resident. <u>Family and friends</u> <u>may visit if the resident has a negative COVID-19 status. Should an outbreak occur or if the resident has a positive COVID-19 status or is in</u> <u>quarantine, visits will not be allowed except by Essential Caregivers.</u>

## End-of-Life Visits

We will make every accommodation possible to allow unrestricted visits to a resident experiencing an end-of-life situation. This includes residents on hospice care or whose prognosis does not indicate recovery—regardless of the resident's COVID-19 status. Visitors to these residents must follow all policies for visitation described below for preparations before the visit, scheduling, and onsite rules.

## **Essential Caregiver Summary**

- Essential caregivers may visit a resident in an indoor or outdoor setting even if an outbreak of COVID-19 has occurred on our campus and regardless of a resident's COVID-19 status. <u>Family and friends cannot visit if an outbreak occurs or if the resident has a positive COVID-19</u> <u>status or is in quarantine.</u>
- TMRC residents may name up to 2 people as "Essential Caregivers."
- This is a permanent decision and should not be changed unless there are major changes in the caregivers' status.
- Residents have been given forms to complete for naming "Essential Caregivers."
- Visitors cannot visit more than one resident at a time, even if they are deemed an "Essential Caregiver" for more than one resident.
- Must complete 15 minute advance training on wearing mask (bring your own), protective equipment, infection control, hand hygiene, cough and sneeze etiquette.
- Essential Caregivers must follow policies described below prior to a visit and upon arrival.

## Schedule Your Visit

Schedule your visit in advance with TMRC staff by calling 817-275-2893 ext. 36.

## Visiting Hours

- Monday through Friday from 7am to 4 pm
- Other visiting times may be scheduled on a case-by-case basis.
- At our sole discretion, we may limit the number of visitors, frequency, and/or duration of visits in an effort to allow all residents to receive visitors and provide for the health and safety of the staff and other residents.

## Upon Arrival at TMRC

- Arrive at rear entry employee entrance Take first right after entering campus. Drive around to the employee parking lot. Enter at check-in area at employee entrance.
- Visitors must wear a mask (bring your own).
- Present a photo ID.
- Allow screening for any sign and symptoms of COVID-19 or respiratory illness.

## During the Visit

- · Visitors must maintain at least 6 ft of distance between themselves and staff or residents other than those they are visiting.
- · Visitors cannot interact with any other resident.
- Visits must take place in the resident's room or in an outdoor area. Common areas cannot be used for visitation.
- · Visitors cannot participate in any community activities like meals, bingo, or other events.
- Visitors and fully vaccinated residents may choose to have close or personal contact during an indoor or outdoor visit. Fully vaccinated
  residents must wear a well-fitting face covering or facemask during close contact. No close contact allowed for unvaccinated residents and
  visitors.

## Update from Gary Blair, Superintendent, Texas Masonic Retirement Center March 11, 2021

## Visitors Welcome for Independent Living Residents!

Any resident living in an apartment or duplex cottage may welcome visitors to their home, room, or an outdoor area.

#### Some limitations must continue for resident and staff safety. Please read over our new rules below:

#### Visitation policies will change under these circumstances

- If the COVID-19 positive case rate for Tarrant County rises above 10%, we may change our visitor policy.
- If a COVID-19 positive diagnosis in a staff member or resident occurs within the past 14 days, we will limit visitors.

#### Visitor Policy – General

- No visitors allowed for any resident currently in quarantine.
- Limited to 2 visitors per resident for any single visit
- Visitors must be free from any signs or symptoms of COVID-19 or any other respiratory infection.

#### **Visiting Hours**

Monday through Friday from 7am to 4 pm

Other visiting times may be scheduled on a case-by-case basis.

#### During Visit

- All visitors must sign in and be screened at the main entrance to TMRC.
- Visitors must sanitize their hands upon entering the building.
- Masks must be worn by both the resident and the visitor during the entire visit.
- Visits must take place in the resident's room or in an outdoor area. Common areas cannot be used for visitation.
- Visitors should take the most direct route to and from a resident's room or an outdoor visiting area. Visitors are not permitted to wander around the building.
- Visitors cannot participate in any community activities like meals, bingo, or other events.




