GENERAL ORDER NO. 1, SERIES 2022-2023

Subject: District Appointments, District Conclaves, Schools of Instruction and Statewide Makeup School of Instruction, Annual Visitation, Blanket Dispensations, Grand Commandery Committee Meetings, Drill and Ritual Competition and the Annual Grand Conclave.

To: The Grand Officers, Past Grand Commanders, Officers and Members of the Constituent Commanderies of Texas.

Greetings:

In accordance with the provisions of the Statutes and Regulations of The Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Texas, the following conditions will be observed during the 2022-2023 Templar year. **These conditions are subject to change contingent on the state of the COVID pandemic and its effects on public safety.**

TEMPLAR DISTRICTS:

DISTRICT CONCLAVES AND SCHOOLS OF INSTRUCTION:

The District Schools of Instruction will be held during the months of June, July, and August 2022, on a date and time agreed upon by the Grand Officer assigned to the District and the host Commandery. The Grand Officers are to be respectful of Blue Lodge, Chapter, Council and Eastern Star installations when setting a date and time for the School. A formal or informal District Conclave should be held to discuss any upcoming events in the District.

The Grand Officer assigned to the District will notify the Commander and the Recorder of each Commandery in the District, Electronic Communications Committee and the Grand Officers of the time and place of the School. Each Commandery, in the announcement of the School, will be reminded of Article 113 of the Statutes and Regulations that reads: "At such Schools of Instruction it shall be the duty of all the officers of each Commandery situated in such District to attend at the time and place designated...and to participate in the work of such School."

ANNUAL INSPECTION AND OFFICIAL VISITATION:

The District Grand Officers will schedule the dates of the Official Visitations to be made in September, October, and November of 2022. Commanderies are reminded that our Statutes and Regulations require them, as a condition of being a Commandery, not only to be able to Open and Close the Commandery in full ritualistic form or the alternate nine man opening ritual, but also to confer the Order of the Temple in accordance with the 1979 Ritual of The Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States of America, as amended by Knight Templar Drill Regulations and Manual of Asylum Ceremonies of The Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Texas (1987). Although authorized by Article 110 of the Statutes and Regulations, while inspections may be held in the same location on the same day, joint conclaves for the purpose of inspection will not be permitted, as each commandery is required to perform its own inspection.

All Commanderies are subject to the following scoring regulations for the J.C. Kidd and Fred M. Gilbough plaques. It should be noted, scoring for the Kidd and Gilbough are a separate item from passing inspection. There is no minimum score for passing inspection. A minimum score of 750 is only required to earn a service award.

Opening and Closing:

- Only those Commanderies who perform the Traditional (18 man) Opening during Inspection can compete for the J.C. Kidd Plaque. However, if every Commandery in a District uses the Alternate 9 Man Opening for their Inspection, then every Commandery can compete for the J.C. Kidd Plaque.
- Ten **(10)** points will be deducted for each officer **not** filling his installed station at the Annual Inspection of the Commandery.
- Fifty (50) points will be awarded for each performing the Traditional (18 man) Opening.

Order of the Temple:

- Ten **(10)** points will be deducted for each officer **not** filling his installed station at the Annual Inspection of the Commandery.
- Commanderies will receive a Twenty **(20)** point bonus for having an actual candidate at the Annual Inspection of the Commandery.
- If the installed Commander or Generalissimo of the Commandery being inspected **does not** give the Remaining Attributes, a twenty **(20)** point penalty will be deducted.

At the next Stated Conclave following receipt of this General Order, each Commander shall read aloud or cause to be read aloud **Chapter 56**, **Article 344**, **345**, **and 346** of **the Statutes and Regulations**, regarding Merit Awards and Service Medals, and the Recorder shall note this event in the minutes.

Commanders are reminded that Article 111 of the Statutes and Regulations requires that the Commander of each Commandery "...cause the members of his Commandery to be notified to attend the visitation of the Grand Officer." All Sir Knights are strongly encouraged to visit other Commanderies, especially during the Official Visitation of the Grand Officer.

BLANKET DISPENSATIONS:

Where not prohibited by law, regulation, or edict, and provided current social distancing and public safety guidelines are strictly adhered to, a Blanket Dispensation is granted for Sir Knights to appear in public in uniform at:

- I. Community events such as parades, dedications, leveling cornerstones, and ceremonies in connection with Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day, Veterans Day, and any dignified public function where Templar Masonry will be promoted.
- II. Church services as a Commandery.
- III.Flag presentation ceremonies for any Masonic-related organization or for public events to promote Masonry, the Eye Foundation, the Holy Land Pilgrimage, or the Educational Foundation.

170TH ANNUAL CONCLAVE:

The 170th Annual Conclave of The Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Texas will be held in Grapevine, Texas, April 13 - 16, 2023 at the Embassy Suites Hotel located at 2401 Bass Pro Drive, Grapevine, TX 76051. Information regarding the 170th Annual Conclave, will be made available on our website and Facebook page. Registration will open at Noon on Thursday, April 13, 2023, at the Embassy Suites Hotel. The business session of the Grand Commandery of Texas will be held on Friday, April 14, 2023, beginning at 8:30 am.

Field Drill Competition will be held in the morning of Saturday, April 15, 2023, using a schedule for Class A, B, C, and D teams and which will be made available at a later date. Entries should be sent to the Chairman of the Field Drill Committee (see Bulletin No. 1) ahead of time if possible.

Competition will be held in the afternoon of Saturday, April 15, 2023, in the Illustrious Order of the Red Cross. The parts for the competition will be: Sovereign Master, Prince Chancellor, Prince Master of the Palace, Master of Dispatches, Companion Conductor, and Warder. The same Sir Knight may perform the Master of Dispatches and Prince Chancellor parts of the ritual. The exact portion of the Order for competition will be presented and demonstrated to the Sir Knights by the Templar Instruction Committee on Thursday evening, April 13, 2023, at a time to be determined. Entries should be sent to the Chairman of the Templar Instruction Committee (See Bulletin No. 1) ahead of time if possible.

The Annual Banquet will be held on Saturday Evening, April 15, 2023. The Annual Conclave will conclude on Sunday, April 16, 2023, with the Divine/Memorial Service at 9:00 am, followed by the Installation of the 2023-2024 Grand Commandery officers.

COMMITTEES:

The Chairman of each Committee shall notify the Grand Officers of all meetings of their Committee as soon as they are scheduled, at least two weeks in advance. If possible, it is requested that any such meetings be held on a Saturday or Sunday, to facilitate the attendance of the Grand Officers at the Committee's meeting. Committees will submit their preliminary reports in writing to the Grand Recorder by March 1, 2023.

The mailing address, telephone numbers and email address of the Grand Commander and the Grand Recorder can be found in Bulletin No. 1.

This General Order is to be read aloud at the next Stated Conclave following its receipt and the action noted by the Recorder in the minutes with a copy attached thereto.

GENERAL ORDER NO.2, SERIES 2022-2023

Subject: Membership Retention and Restoration Committee, Liaison Committee, Member Citation Cord Award Program and Grand Officer Availability.

To: The Grand Officers, Past Grand Commanders, Officers and Members of the Constituent Commanderies of Texas.

Sir Knights, Greetings:

MEMBERSHIP RETENTION AND RESTORATION COMMITTEE

If the Commander has not done so already, he should immediately appoint a Membership Retention and Restoration Committee, consisting of at least 3 to 5 Sir Knights.

- 1. This Committee should work with the Recorder to identify every Sir Knight in danger of being suspended for Non-Payment of Dues. The Committee should contact these members to keep them from going suspended. The Committee should find ways, if possible, to pay or remit the dues of those Sir Knights who are unable to pay their dues for financial or health reasons.
- 2. This Committee should also work with the Recorder to identify every Sir Knight who has been suspended for any reason during the last ten years. The Committee should contact these Sir Knights and see if they would like to become members in good standing of the Commandery again. Encourage them to participate and be active members if possible.

The Committee should report their findings to the Commandery on a regular basis.

LIAISON COMMITTEE

The Commandery should appoint, as soon as possible, a Liaison Committee consisting of one Sir Knight from every Masonic Lodge to which the members of the Commandery belong. The Committee Members should:

- 1. Keep the lodge they represent informed of all activities of the Commandery.
- 2. Keep their lodges supplied with information on the York Rite.
- 3. Contact the Worshipful Master of the lodge they represent, and offer to do programs on the York Rite, Flag Presentations for installations and special open meetings, and to assist when needed in the conferral of the Blue Lodge degree work.

The Committee should report their actions to the Commandery on a regular basis.

MEMBER CITATION CORD AWARD PROGRAM

Commanderies are encouraged to participate in the Member Citation Cord program found in Art. 346 (B) of the Statues and Regulations of the Grand Commandery of Texas. When a Sir Knight has qualified for a Cord Award, he should have his Recorder fill out the following form and send it to the Grand Recorder and the Chairman of the Membership Committee of the Grand Commandery. Contact information for both Sir Knights can be found in Bulletin No. 1.

AVAILABILITY OF GRAND COMMANDERY OFFICERS

Your Grand Commandery officers are available to confer the Order of the Temple when requested. Please contact the Grand Commander if you desire to have the Grand Officers confer the Order of the Temple in your Commandery.

This General Order shall be read aloud at the next Stated Conclave following its receipt, or as soon as possible thereafter, and the action noted by the Recorder in the minutes with a copy attached thereto.

Subject: Grand Commander's Ritual of Excellence Award

To: The Grand Officers, Past Grand Commanders, Officers and Members of the Constituent Commanderies of Texas

Greetings, Sir Knights:

Purpose:

To promote full form ritual work in the Illustrious Order of the Red Cross and the Order of Malta. Each Commandery as an individual team or a District as a combined team will be eligible to receive the award or either or both Orders. Awards will be presented at the Banquet during the 170th Grand Conclave of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Texas.

Award:

Individual Commandery Team: "Grand Commander's Ritual Excellence – Commandery" for "The Illustrious Order of the Red Cross" or "The Order of Malta", or both.

District Combined Team: "Grand Commander's Ritual Excellence - District" for "The Illustrious Order of the Red Cross" or "The Order of Malta", or both.

Requirements to Qualify:

The Judge, using their own standards, will determine if the conferral is sufficient to qualify for the award. The form(s) (included here) must be filled out and signed by the Judge and then filed with the Grand Commander.

The Order must be conferred on a live candidate and must be performed in full form (costumes are not required). No ritual books or other forms of written ritual are allowed to be used, except by the Judge, who cannot be a member of the ritual team. The form, included with this General Order, must be received in the Grand Commander's office no later than March 1, 2023, to be awarded at the Banquet. It can be sent to the Grand Commander by mail or electronically. If both Orders are being awarded include a form for each Order. Conferral of the Order can be at a Festival.

Individual Commandery Team: **All** members of the ritual team must be members of the same Commandery.

District Combined Team: <u>All</u> members of the ritual team must be members of a Commandery within the same District.

Subject: Grand Commandery Ritual Certificate Program

To: The Grand Officers, Past Grand Commanders, Officers and Members of the Constituent Commanderies of Texas

Greetings, Sir Knights:

Purpose:

To recognize those Sir Knights dedicating themselves to the preservation of our Ritual and qualify them as instructors. To improve the quality of our ritual work, increase interest in the ritual, provide an incentive to learn, encourage Sir Knights to learn the Malta and Red Cross ritual and to have some fun while we learn. Every Sir Knight under the jurisdiction of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Texas is eligible to earn and hold an Instructor Certificate. There are seven Instructor Certificates available.

- 1. Instructor of the Asylum
- 2. Instructor of the Order of the Temple
- 3. Instructor of the Council of the Illustrious Order of the Red Cross
- 4. Instructor of the Illustrious Order of the Red Cross
- 5. Instructor of the Priory of Malta
- 6. Instructor of the Order of Malta
- 7. Master Instructor of the Commandery

Qualifications:

Instructor of the Asylum - All parts in the full traditional form of the opening and closing ceremony of a Commandery of Knights Templar.

Instructor of the Order of the Temple – All parts of the Order of the Temple.

Instructor of the Council of the Illustrious Order of the Red Cross – All parts in the opening and closing ceremony for a Council of the Illustrious Order of the Red Cross.

Instructor of the Illustrious Order of the Red Cross – All parts in the Order of the Illustrious Order of the Red Cross.

Instructor of the Priory of Malta – All parts in the opening and closing ceremony for a Priory of Malta. Instructor of the Order of Malta – All parts in the Order of Malta.

Master Instructor of the Commandery – Earn all six of the above certificates. You are not required to earn all six in one year.

Certificates can be earned one at a time or in multiples. Certificates can be earned in any order. It is not required to earn all Certificates; each is a stand-alone Certificate and qualifies the Sir Knight to be an Instructor for that Certificate ritual.

Examinations:

Examinations should be held at least once a year in each District by the District Templar Instruction Committeeman or by a Grand Officer. Sir Knights desiring to sit for an examination may request one from any member of the Templar Instruction Committee or a Grand Commandery Officer. The time and place of the Examination will be set by the Examiner. A Sir Knight can sit for an examination wherever they are held.

The examination will follow a round-robin format as is done in the Grand Lodge of Texas Certificate program. The Examiner is the sole decision maker on the performance of a Sir Knight being examined and his decision on whether to issue a certificate cannot be appealed.

All certificates are Lifetime Certificates.

All certificates earned during the 2022-2023 Templar year will be awarded at the Banquet during the 170th Grand Conclave of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Texas. To receive the certificate at the Banquet the form below must be received by the Grand Commander no later than March 1, 2023.
