A message from the Eminent Grand Prelate Sir Knight Brad Billings, KCT

Have you ever experienced a setback or obstacle in your life? It is almost a rhetorical question as anyone who has minute experience in life will have certainly suffered what they perceive to be a setback. We've all had difficult times in our lives whether it be a personal struggle, professional obstacle or simply having to deal with a circumstance beyond our control.

Adversity is a universal experience that touches each of our lives at different times and in different ways and, while adversity is never fun to deal with, it can lead us to the next chapter of our story as it presents us with an obstacle to overcome by growth, resilience or transformation.

Remember the story of Joseph, the baby of the family; the twelfth and favorite son of Jacob. He made me father to Pharaoh, lord of his entire household and ruler of all Egypt. Genesis 45:5-8

Adversity builds character and the things we experience can make us more patient, tolerant, empathetic, and understanding. If we look at our lives as part of the overall plan from God, we should look to learn from every experience. Especially those we perceive as the bad times.
